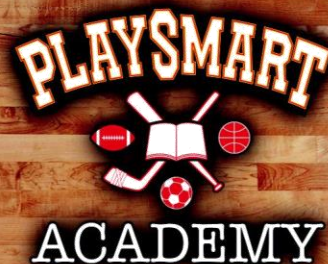

MINIMAL REQUIREMENTS TO BE CONSIDERED A PLAYSMART ACADEMY VOLUNTEER

- Incoming sophomores through seniors only. Recent graduates permitted.
- Must be in good academic standing for the previous school year and must provide a character reference from a teacher, coach or adult mentor (no parents or family members).
- Must be able to commit to the FULL Academy schedule which includes; Monday through Friday 8:30 am – 3:00 pm, a 3 to 4 hour staff training session (dates announced weeks in advance) and a pre-Academy briefing the week before opening day.
- Previous experience working with middle school students in a camp or sports program a plus.
- Must be a go-getter, have good leadership skills, be energetic and passionate about helping young kids, a team player and comfortable working with diverse groups of kids/people.

This is a competitive process as there are limited spots available. Only those who meet all of the above criteria will receive an interview. Interviews do not guarantee selection.
